Speakers



Alex Filicevas

President, All.Can International and Executive Director, World Bladder Cancer Patient Coalition

Alex Filicevas serves as the President of the All.Can International. He was part of All.Can since its first year, also serving as a Steering Committee member since 2018. Alex is also the Executive Director of the World Bladder Cancer Patient Coalition (WBCPC), where he leads the work of the organisation to foster an international community of strong bladder cancer patient advocates. Alex is an EUPATI graduate and prior to joining the World Bladder Cancer Patient Coalition, he was leading EU affairs work at Europe's largest cancer patient umbrella organisation, where he focused on advocacy activities, capacity building and policy initiatives with a particular focus on overarching issues faced by cancer patients and their carers in Europe. As a consultant, Alex has supported a number of private and non-governmental organisations in successful advocacy efforts at the EU level on a range of disease areas and issue-specific public health challenges.



Vivek Muthu

Managing Director, Marivek Healthcare Consulting

Dr Vivek Muthu's work focuses on health systems sustainability, value and efficiency. Starting at the British Medical Journal, he helped to develop and lead a team examining the clinical value of drugs and devices. He then founded Bazian, a company providing analytics and evidence to payers and providers, to help them deliver high-quality, safe, cost effective care. Bazian was acquired by the Economist Group to create its healthcare practice, which was led by Vivek. Vivek now holds non-executive and advisory positions in a number of healthcare companies and is involved in health policy initiatives focused on improving equity, sustainability and efficiency on health systems. He regularly chairs, and speaks at, international summits on these topics for the Economist, for industry, and for NGO and third sector participants in healthcare.

**Professor, Chair of Innovation and Value in Health,
Université de Paris**

A professor at the University of Paris School of Medicine, Gregory Katz holds the Chair of Innovation & Value in Health. He is the academic director of the EU report entitled Implementing Value-Based Health Care in Europe: Handbook for Pioneers (EIT Health, 2020). He is also president of PromTime, a health data science company commissioned by the French Ministry of Health to incentivize practitioners on high-value care. He also served as director of research & innovation at private hospital groups in Europe.



Kathy Oliver

**Chair and Founding Co-Director, The International
Brain Tumour Alliance**

Kathy is Chair/founding Co-Director of the International Brain Tumour Alliance (IBTA), a global network established in 2005 as a dynamic worldwide community for brain tumour patient organisations and others involved in neuro-oncology (see www.theibta.org). Kathy campaigns for equitable access to therapies, the establishment of brain tumour patient/caregiver support groups in countries where they don't yet exist and raises awareness of this devastating disease. She's involved in high-level, international initiatives on efficiency in cancer care; patient-reported outcomes; rare cancers; quality of life; rights-based advocacy; guidelines; palliative care and regulatory matters. Kathy has authored/co-authored a wide range of journal papers, book chapters and magazine articles.

Christobel Saunders

Research and Evidence WG co-Chair and Board member, All.Can International and Professor of Surgical Oncology, University of Western Australia

Professor Saunders AO, is internationally recognised as one of Australia's most prominent research-orientated cancer surgeons. She has substantially contributed to breast cancer research including clinical trials of new treatments, psychosocial, translational and health services research and surgical oncology cancer research. Christobel has been acknowledged through numerous awards the most recent being the AO (Order of Australia) (2018). She has performed research for >30 years and sits on the boards of a number of cancer organisations. Christobel is involved in strategic planning and management of cancer services in WA as author of the WA Health Cancer Services Framework, she is the Inaugural Chair of the state Health Service Provider, PathWest Laboratory Medicine.



Niek Klazinga

Head of the Health Care Quality Indicator Programme, OECD

Niek Klazinga is since 2006 the strategic lead of the Health Care Quality and Outcomes program at the OECD in Paris. He combines this work with a professorship in Social Medicine at the Academic Medical Centre at the University of Amsterdam. Dr. Klazinga has been involved over the past 30 years in numerous health services research projects and policy debates on quality of care and published widely on the subject. Present commitments include a visiting professorship at the Corvinus University in Budapest and the University of Toronto, advisor to WHO/Euro, advisor to the Canadian Institute for Health Informatics and member of the Quality Council of the Dutch Health Care Institute (ZIN). Since 2018 his research group in Amsterdam is coordinating a large EU funded program with 14 PhD fellows on performance intelligence. Dr. Klazinga has (co)authored around 200 articles in peer-reviewed journals and to date completed the supervision of 36 PhD trajectories.

Professor Dipak Kalra is President of the European Institute for Innovation through Health Data, which promotes the learning health ecosystem by developing solutions to scale up the trustworthy uses health data. Dipak has led multiple EC and IMI projects, and ISO standards development, in EHR interoperability standards, data protection, business models and the reuse of EHRs for research. Current projects include generating real world evidence in pregnancy, the governance of patient-centric clinical trials, multi-stakeholder perspectives and governance recommendations on the European Health Data Space, the collection of outcomes by hospitals and promoting the value of research to the public.

Antonella Cardone is the Director of the European Cancer Patient Coalition (ECPC), which is the largest cancer patient umbrella organization in Europe with over 450 members from 48 countries. Prior to ECPC, Antonella was the Executive Director of the Fit for Work Global Alliance, a multi-stakeholder coalition championing change in health and work policy. She has previously served as the Director of the Global Smoke-free Partnership of the American Cancer Society, leading a movement of over 100 members to coordinate the development of smoke-free laws in 40 countries. She holds a Master's in Science and one in Business Administration. She currently represents ECPC on the Board of Pancreatic Cancer Europe, in which she is vice-chair, and she is also Board Member of All.Can.

Dr Roberta Ortiz is a pediatric oncologist from Nicaragua. She joined WHO NCDs Department in 2020 as the focal point for the Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer. Over the past fifteen years, she has worked with collaborative regional networks of professionals, supported by international partners, such as St Jude Children's Research Hospital and Monza's International School of Pediatric Hematology-oncology (MISPHO) to improve cancer care through education, implementing protocol-based care, and sharing best practices among centers. Before joining the WHO cancer team, she worked at the National Pediatric Oncology Centre in Managua, Manuel de Jesus Rivera Children's Hospital. She also worked with the National Ministry of Health to develop a national palliative care program for children with life-threatening diseases.

Dr Matti Aapro is a medical oncologist, Board Member of All.Can, Director at the Genolier Cancer Center in Switzerland, President of the European Cancer Organisation, President of Sharing Progress in Cancer Care, and Board Member of the European School of Oncology and the International Society for Geriatric Oncology. He is also an Editor of the Journal of Cancer Policy, Honorary Editor of Critical Reviews in Oncology/Hematology, Associate Editor for the geriatric section of The Oncologist and an Editorial Board member of the Journal of Geriatric Oncology and Annals of Oncology. His main interest areas are new drug development, breast cancer, cancer in the elderly and supportive care.
