- Stakeholder analysis Identification & listing of the major cancer care stakeholders in Greece
- Interviews & consultation with 8 main oncological hospitals & major health & oncology stakeholders



2 September-October Quantitative analysis Recording of the existing enabling factors & of the existing barriers/areas for improvement

Recommendations SWOT analysis & recommendations tailored for the improvement of cancer care efficiency pursuant to the data derived & linked to national & regional policies

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MAJOR FINDINGS





- ✓ National **debate and political will** to invest in improving the national health data ecosystem
- ✓ Regulation for supportive & palliative care
- ✓ Funding allocation
- Electronic patient records and cancer registry have been implemented
- ✓ Digitalisation strategy in place
- ✓ Policies to address workforce shortages & working conditions are being implemented and monitored
- ✓ Political will to regulate the role of **oncology nurses**
- ✓ The role of cancer nurses is regulated
- ✓ National legislation and regulations in place pertaining to the composition of multidisciplinary tumour boards
- ✓ ongoing process for the rollout of additional Comprehensive
 Cancer Centres & participation in the EUnetCCC Joint Action
- ✓ Political debate & legislation about involving patients in decision making
- ✓ National initiatives that **collect PREMs & PROMs** in standardised ways both coordinated in national level & embedded in health data infrastructure through electronic health records

- × No cancer control **plan** or strategy in place
- × No standardized pathways have been developed
- No publicly available indicators on waiting times& the quality of care, such as adverse events
- No national, federal, regional or organisational strategies to monitor and reduce preventable medication-related harms Absence of monitoring of 5-year survival rates
- No electronic patient portal with clinical information available to people
- No mechanisms of feedback and learning in place
- Patients do not have access to data
- Number of professionals/population with cancer is not monitored no dedicated plans for different professional roles
- Patient access to oncology nurses is not monitored
- Cancer patient navigators are not regulated
- No incentive mechanisms utilised to ensure the systematic gathering of patient-reported data



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MAJOR RECOMMENDATIONS

Timeliness of care



- Develop a National Cancer Plan with clear targets & indicators for diagnosis, treatment & access times.
- Establish timely access standards & indicators
- ✓ Integrate & interconnect databases the monitoring & evaluation of care effectiveness, to support
- Enhance the interoperability of digital systems.
- Create an electronic patient portal for access to personal & clinical data

Coordination of care



- Establish communication & feedback mechanisms between general practitioners, oncologists & hospital units.
- Regulate & institutionalize the role of cancer patient navigators
- ✓ Establishment of minimum staffing standards for healthcare professionals in care and systematic monitoring of ratios by cancer type & level of care.
- ✓ Strengthening of MDTs with mandatory documentation of meetings & decisions.
- Develop & certify Comprehensive
 Cancer Centers in a national network.

Patient-centeredness



- Establish incentives for the systematic collection of patient-reported outcomes (PROMs/PREMs) to be incorporated into decision making & quality assessment
- Strengthening the participation of patients heir associations in the co-development of cancer policies & strategies
 - Expanding education & information policies for patients & caregivers to empower them in decision-making about their care.
- Integrating PROMs & PREMs into cancer registries and electronic health systems
- Enhancing transparency & accessibility of data so that patients can monitor their progress and care
